POSITIVE DISCIPLINE PROJECT 2001/02.

The addition of the Positive Discipline scheme, to the old familiar system of penalising students who misbehave, is designed to encourage students to take responsibility for how they choose to behave and work in school. It also gives teachers a chance to acknowledge in an immediate and consistent way the good efforts of most students.

Students are issued with **Merit Stamp Books** and, by now, most have earned enough stamps to have gained a number of **Merit Cards**. These cards are brought home in a special folder, which should be kept in a safe place. It is primarily a record, for the parent's benefit, of the success achieved by your son or daughter in their day-to-day academic endeavours. Each Merit Card in the folder represents **150 Merit Stamps** earned for positive behaviour in class by the student.

Merit Stamps and Cards give immediate acknowledgement to the student's efforts to behave responsibly and courteously and to work to the best of their ability. Merit Card holders have also qualified for extra privileges (vouchers for McDonalds, UCI and Golden Discs) on different occasions throughout the school year. Our traditional Christmas and End-of-Year Merit Award Ceremonies when certificates are awarded for Academic Endeavour, 1st and 2nd Year Awards are now based on the number of Merit Cards which a student has collected.

TRANSITION YEAR 2001-2002

This year's group have crammed in more activities than any of their predecessors in the history of TY. Let's see now, there was a visit to **Kiltiernan** last autumn to try a hand at skiing. Then there was a trip to **Carlingford Adventure Centre** for canoeing, rock climbing, etc. Appropriately enough this was followed by a week-long **First-Aid Course**.

As part of the Transition Year Religious Education Programme, students visited the *Mission Alive Festival of Mission* in the RDS last October. The Festival was a celebration of faith. As emigrants and missionaries Irish people have experienced many cultures, religions and languages. The Festival was a celebration of all peoples reaching out and on the move. Appreciation was expressed for all that has gone before while looking forward with hope to the challenges facing Ireland today.

It was an interactive experience. Students came into contact with different countries, cultures and languages across the five continents where missionaries work. They shared in dance and music and had a chance to taste food from different parts of the world. They learned about the concerns of missionaries: child labour, world debt, migrants and refugees, HIV/AIDS, care of the environment. On arrival students received a "visa" which was stamped at various stands to remind visitors of the issues facing those from other cultures who come to live here.

Also in October, Ms. O'Reilly organised a very successful Halloween Horror Tour around the school and Cinderella in rhyme and drag, with all proceeds going to the **Action Track** Fund. For the Christmas market, **Mini-company** manufactured key-rings using a wood burner to inscribe the various designs. We're told that the order books filled up quickly and sales volumes were good. Later on in the year they expanded into making solitaire games.

A flavour of the rest of the year's exploits in the most diverse places can be gleaned from the following list of visits: as well as the **Mission Alive Exhibition** in the RDS, there was **Mountjoy Prison**, **Westwood Gym**, walking/hiking in **Howth**, **Wicklow** and in **Glendalough**. One of the undoubted highlights of the year was the visit to **Skirmish**, the Irish Paintballing centre in Wicklow. Of course there was the usual favourite, **Action Track Week**, which was a massive success attracting a large crowd to the play **King Mary's Game** on the final night.

TYs also managed to fit in collecting for the National Children's Hospital on their flag-day, the annual sponsored walk and of course their four weeks of work experience during the year. All 27 students found jobs over a wide range of employment including teaching, law, photography, the army and the fire-service. Students graduate from Transition Year at the end of May, when their end of year play "**The Scroll**", written by **Paul McKenna** and **Patrick O'Hanlon**, will be performed for the parents. At the graduation ceremony each student receives a folder which contains various assessments based on their performance during the year and a **Gold, Silver or Bronze Award** for their commitment.

FUND RAISING

Helping ourselves:

On behalf of the Ardscoil la Salle Parents' Association, thanks to all who helped with the raffle last Christmas, specially the ticket sellers. Almost €3,000 was raised and **Damien O'Toole 1M**, deserves a special mention for selling more than 20 books of tickets.

The school's **Annual Sponsored Walk** raises money for the sports' fund. The €4000 target has been surpassed again this year. Thanks to all who participated and supported the school in this way.

Helping our neighbour:

€2,159 was raised by 90 students who took part in the **Concern Christmas Fast**, an exceptional achievement for all concerned. Special mention for the **students from 1.1** who raised over €400 and for **Stephen Cassidy, Philip Reddin, Laura Meehan, Adrian Eustace, Andrea, Mullen, and Claire Sunderland** who each collected more than €60. The top collector, **Stephen Sunderland** raised over €100. Sincere thanks to all the students who fasted and to the many staff and parents who sponsored them. Thanks are also due to **Ms. McCabe** who organised the event and to **Ms. Rickard** and **Sr. Carmel** who assisted.

This year's **Trócaire Lenten Campaign** focused on the issue of child slavery. Student support raised €332.

A **Living Gift** describes the novel scheme initiated by the charity **Bóthar**. A non-uniform day before Easter raised €343, which Bóthar will use to send an Irish dairy goat to an African Family. The family will be trained to care for the goat and her first female kid will be passed on to another family. Goat's milk and cheese provide nourishment for the families and any surplus can be sold.....Your euro is making a difference.

An annual visitor to our school is **Brother John Gaul** who lived in Nigeria for over 30 years. He told students of the plight of AIDS sufferers in Nigeria and Zambia where hundreds of thousands of children have been orphaned by the disease which is now the biggest killer in those countries. A non-uniform day was held in May, which raised €400 to be sent to Br. John.

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2002

6th Year student **Stephen Cassidy** will be travelling to Canada in July to take part in World Youth Day, a celebration of young people, by young people and the Church.

From July 18-22, young people from all around the world will be welcomed into the homes of Catholic families across Canada. Participants will come together in Toronto for the main events of the celebration.

World Youth Day consists of prayer, teachings on the gospel and aspects of faith, but of course also meeting new friends and having fun. Pope John Paul plans to attend and it is expected that one million young people will be present when he says Mass at the conclusion of this celebration.

SPORTS ROUND-UP

SOCCER

U18 Boys: There is a special cup competition which is designed to give older 6th year players a chance to represent their school. **Stephen McDonnell, Paul Foley, Mark Rodden and Mark Keogh** who are over-age for the U17s were eligible to play in this category. They played Templeogue College in an away fixture at their grounds last autumn. Players such as **Mark Rodden and Adrian Eustace** made their debut for the school and gave a good account of themselves. Other notable 6th year performers were centre-half **Stephen McDonnell, Brian Fitzgerald and Paddy Sweeney** who has amazing pace. Templeogue opened the scoring after 3 minutes but a 30 yard kick from **Alan McCormack** had the scores back level after 5 minutes. The game tightened considerably at this point and scoring chances were scarce. It was not until late in the second-half that the deadlock was broken. A long throw by **Alan McCormack** was headed in by **Stephen Murtagh**. 2-1 to De la Salle. We clung on grimly for the final 15 minutes to record a well deserved victory on that score-line.

The U18s played a second round cup match away to Coolmine C.S. on Nov.28th last. The game was a thriller in every sense of the word. De la Salle opened brightly and had the better of the exchanges in a scoreless first-half. We took the lead after the break with a well-worked goal by **Eamon Dunne**, but Coolmine came back to equalise and later snatched a 2-1 lead. Right on full-time, **Alan McCormack** levelled the scores again and sent the game into extra time. With both teams visibly exhausted, there were no further goals and the dreaded penalty shoot-out followed. Both sides scored 4 out of 5 and at this stage it became a sudden death contest. **Stephen McDonnell** scored for us and goal-keeper, **Brian McCann** followed this with a brilliant match-winning save which put us through to the 3rd round of the Competition.

Unfortunately it would go no further for the U18s. Playing away to St. Benildus, another De la Salle school, we had all the play but try as we might there was no converting it into scores on the day. Benildus scored quite early in the game but in spite of the many shots on target, some of which rattled the woodwork, we just couldn't get on the scoreboard. Final score 1-0.

U17 Boys: The U17's Dublin League campaign got off on the right note with a 5-2 win in a home fixture against Drimnagh Castle. A brilliant hat-trick by **Alan McCormack** was further enhanced by scores from **Eamon Dunne and James Chambers**. Unfortunately we lost 2-1 to Synge St., in our next match, but we had already qualified for the knockout stage of the competition as runners-up to group winners, Synge Street.. Our first game in the last 16 was against Colaiste Choilm, Swords.

Meeting Colaiste Choilm was disastrous in everything but the result. **Karl Cox**, an excellent and promising player was seriously injured. Karl was carried from the field with a badly broken leg which will keep him out of football for the foreseeable future. His team-mates pulled together and defeated Swords 3-0. A league quarter-final followed, at home to Palmerstown. Despite being short

some key players and thanks in no small way to the goal-keeping skills of **Andy Shorthall**, we inflicted a 2-1 defeat on them and progressed to the semi-final against Blackrock College after Christmas. We strengthened our squad by adding **Brian McCann**, a very talented second year student, to replace Karl and beat Blackrock 2-1 on their home ground. The Dublin League Final was played at home against St. Benildus. Ardscoil la Salle, without Karl Cox and Alan McCormack on the field, were trailing 1-0 until Stephen Murtagh moved up from defence to mid-field and soon equalised. Sadly the benefit of this masterful stroke by team manager Mr. O'Brien was short-lived. The score was 1-1 at the final whistle. The penalty shoot-out did not go our way and our League winning dreams were over....for the moment.

The U17s also played in the Leinster Senior Cup Competition which runs simultaneous with the League. Our opening match in the tough first round was against Birr C.C. Led by **Stephen Murtagh**, the U17s saw off the Birr challenge in devastating fashion with a 5-1 victory. New find **Adrian Eustace** scored a hat-trick, while Eamon Dunne and, the as yet uninjured, Karl Cox got one each.

The U17s went on to a decisive win over St. Killians, Bray. Just after Christmas a 3rd round cup-tie at home to Ballyhale V.S. was played on a very windy day in Edenmore. A 3-2 victory over Ballyhale took us into the quarter-finals against Athlone C.C. which ended 0-0 at full-time. Yet another penalty shoot-out, but this time one ending in our favour. Now we moved up to play St. Ciaran's C.C., Leixlip in the semi-final. Coming from behind, our lads levelled the match 2-2 and still another shoot-out which again went our way.

U15 Boys: In the Leinster League Competition, De la Salle playing at home, beat St. Pauls (Raheny), 7-1. A hat-trick for **Paul McCabe** left St. Pauls trailing 3-0 at half-time. Further goals were contributed by **Ciaran Purdy**, **Blaine Dixon** and **James Chambers** with a late consolation goal coming as the only response from a weakened St. Paul's side. In their second League game, the U15s were missing some key players. **John Sweeny** and **Colin Rodden** did well as replacements in a tough away game against Ballymun Comprehensive. In a game which yielded few chances to either side, the score-line was 0-0 at half-time. After the break, Ballymun scored first leaving De la Salle trailing for most of the second-half. The last-gasp equaliser came from Blaine Dixon who scored a good goal to save the day. Full-time score: 1-1. The U15s have also played two Leinster Cup games. In a home fixture, they beat Tullow Community School. A physically strong side, Tullow held us off with the score stuck at 0-0 until well into the second-half. De la Salle were rewarded for keeping up the pressure when Tyrrell scored from a corner kick. The final 15 minutes of the game were tense and anxious. We had to wait until the very last minute before **Paul Lawlor** made it safe. Final score: 2-0.

In their second Cup game against St. Finians, Mullingar, the U15s had the worst possible start, conceding a penalty after 3 minutes. However a further 3 minutes saw Ciaran Purdy score an equaliser which steadied the ship. Some attractive football followed with the game favouring De la Salle everywhere but on the scoreboard. Late in the first-half James Tyrrell won a penalty which was converted by James Chambers leaving us 2-1 ahead at half-time. But not for long. Finians equalised moments into the second-half to make it anybody's game at 2-2. James Chambers rescued the game for us again when he scored from a free-kick at the edge of the box. De la Salle looked like winners from here on. It was **Barry McGee** who put the game beyond doubt with a fourth goal. Final Score: 4-2.

On 22nd Nov. last we played St. Benildus College in the knockout stages of the League Competition. Nothing went right for us in this game which we lost 4-1. The game had barely started when we conceded a goal and shortly afterwards we lost our goal-keeper in a very late tackle which went unpunished. We also lost the valuable services of **Brian McCann** early in the 2nd half.

In the Cup Competition, there was reasonable confidence that we would qualify for the quarter-final by beating Malahide C. S. However bad weather had left the playing surface in a terrible state and the U15s characteristic flowing game evaded them on the day. Malahide made the better start and our centre forwards, Brian McCann and **Alan Keogh**, needed to make some telling tackles and interceptions in the opening minutes. As the game progressed, De la Salle seemed to come more into it and winger Barry Magee made two good opportunities for striker Ciaran Purdy but that opening goal just wouldn't come. An excellent 25 yard strike from mid-fielder, James Chambers, forced a good save from the Malahide keeper and soon after Ciaran Purdy had the best chance of the game, but his shot was stopped on the line in a brilliant block by a Malahide defender. No joy either in the 2nd half. The game became more frantic and physical with both sides desperate to get on the scoreboard. At full-time the teams were still deadlocked 0-0. Penalty taking was difficult in the muddy conditions. De la Salle could only manage to convert one and in spite of a great save by Andy Shorthall, Malahide went through 2-1. Excellent performances from several De la Salle players but man of the match had to be Brian McCann for his flawless defence work at centre-half.

As testimony to the talent of the U15s, if testimony were needed, **Brian McCann** and **James Chambers** have been selected several times at international level and are both on the panel for the Republic of Ireland against Northern Ireland match in May 2002. In addition, Brian, James and U15s **Andy Shorthall**, **Alan J. Keogh**, **James Tyrrell** and **Keith Grehan** have picked up Leinster Senior Cup medals when they lined out for the U17 school side. All of which bodes well for next year's U17s!
