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Foreword

I believe that it will be positive respectful relationships amongst all the partners, combined with hard work and dedication, which will assist us to find alternative routes to our destination.

We are all in the middle of trying to find creative ways of dealing with present challenges. I sincerely hope we arrive at our destinations with interesting stories to tell and that our world will be a better place as a result.

The school year of 2009 kicked off to a really great start when within eight weeks the transition year students had raised €2,700 for Focus Ireland and Autism Ireland.

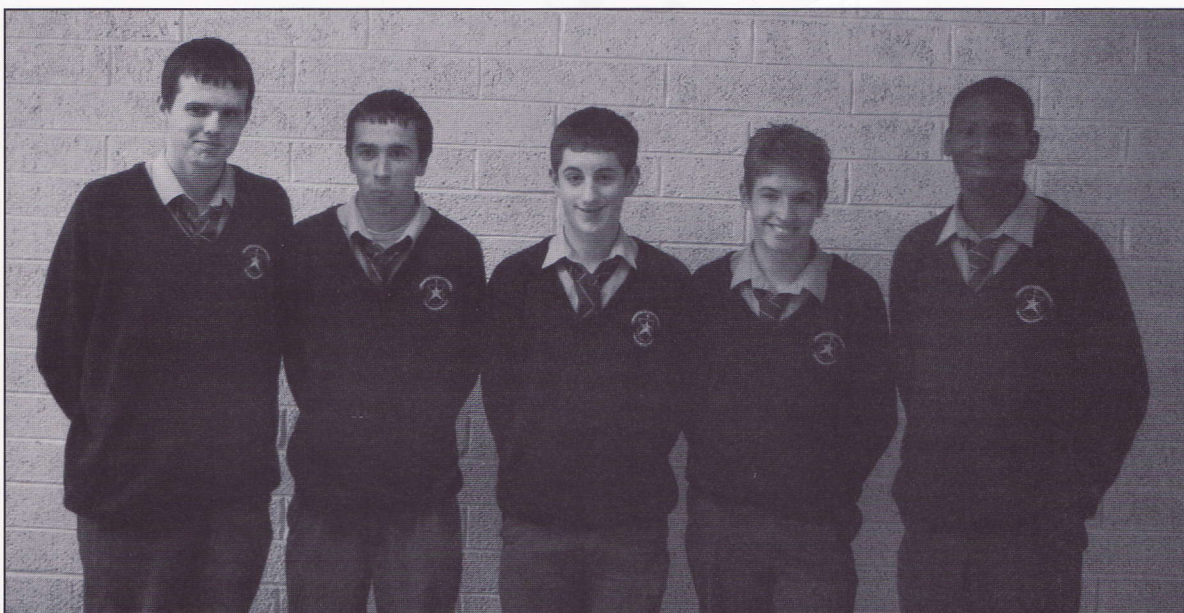
Some students partook in Rose Week and sold roses in Northside Shopping Centre for the Autism Society of Ireland and €1,500 was raised for this charity.

Time as a Teacher

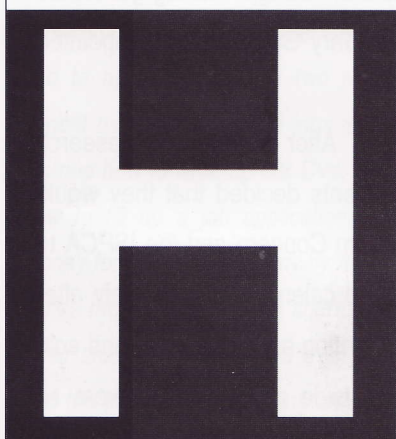

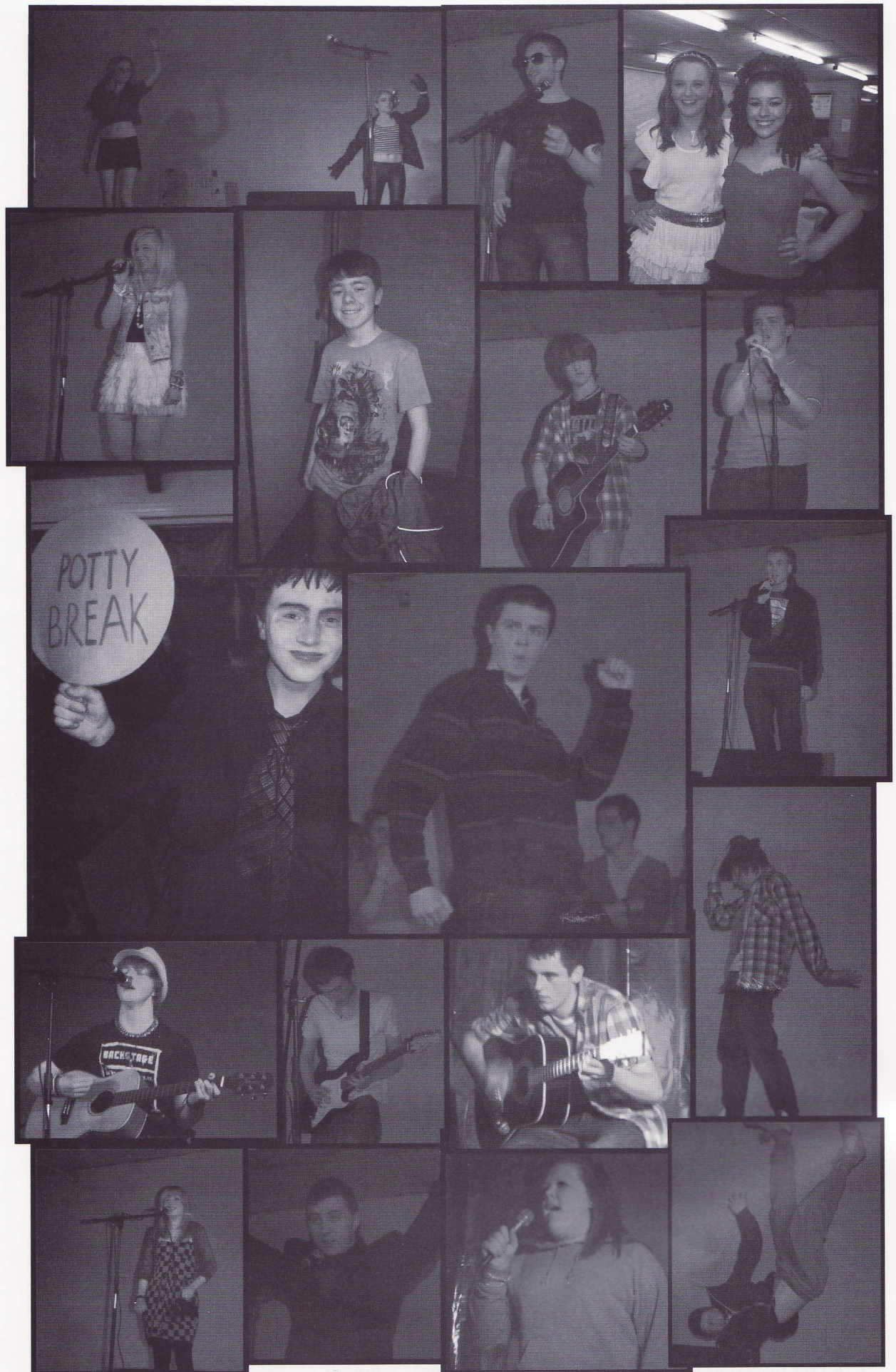
TALENT SHOW 2010

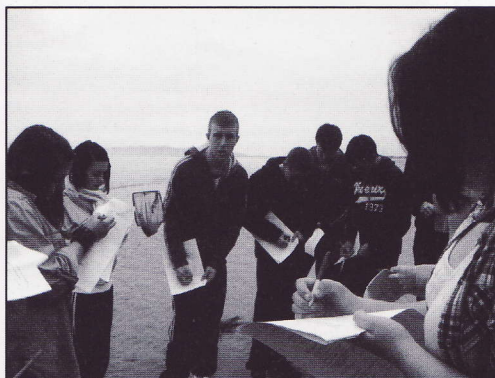

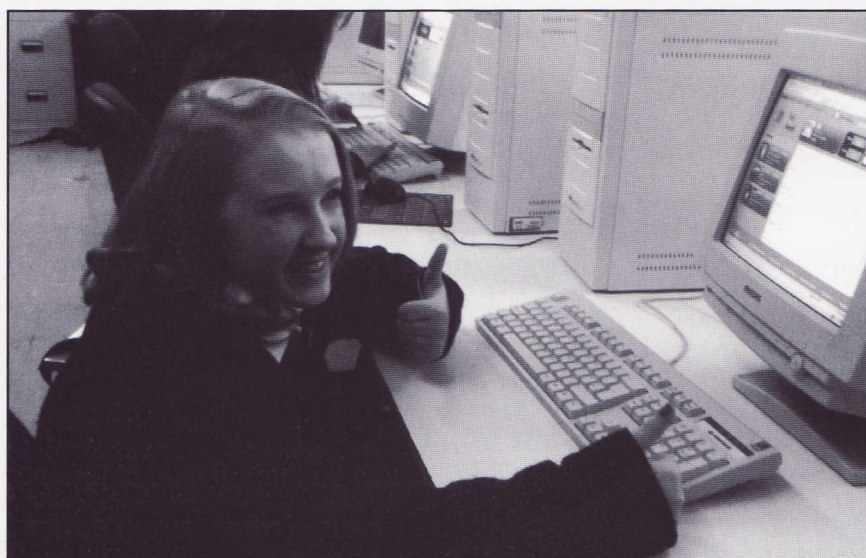

After-School Clubs:



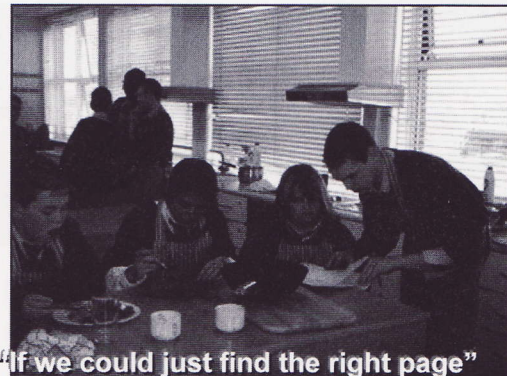
